

Junior/Senior Banquet Guidelines

March 15, 2010

We want our Juniors and Seniors (and the chaperones) to enjoy the activities of the Junior/Senior Banquet that is reserved for freshmen and above. We want standards of good taste, principles of respect for oneself and for the sensitivities of others, and moral values which honor our Christian heritage to be upheld at all times throughout the activity. The student conduct at the banquet will be governed by HBA's behavioral regulations as noted in the Middle & High School Student Handbook & Catalogue 2009-2010.

Attire: The attire for the banquet must be in good taste and consistent with the degree of formality of the event. Clothing which is provocative, revealing, or inappropriate for high school students may not be worn at the activity. Students and guests whose attire does not meet the standard will be prohibited from entering or dismissed from the banquet. No refund will be issued. The following are examples of appropriate and inappropriate attire:

Appropriate	Inappropriate
[both] formal wear	[both] t-shirts/tank tops/shorts/jeans/casual pants
[guys] dress shirt/dress pants/dress shoes	[both] casual or athletic shoes/casual hats or caps
[guys] suit and tie or tuxedo/dress hats allowed	[both] hair which is not one's "natural color" or close to one's natural color
[girls] floor-length evening dress	[both] exposed tattoos and body piercing jewelry
[girls] sleeveless/backless dress and top that do not dip below the waistline and fully cover the cleavage and sides	[guys] earrings/hair length covering eyes, ears, or collars
[girls] a maximum of two earrings conventionally worn	[girls] extreme necklines, exposed cleavage or sides, bare midriffs
[girls] dress shoes	[girls] dresses with slits more than 5 inches above the line in back of the knee
	[girls] more than two conventionally worn earrings or other body-piercing jewelry

Dancing: Social dancing includes fast and slow body movements between a couple of the opposite gender. It does not include movements that are provocative, vulgar, or dangerous. Inappropriate dancing includes but is not limited to dancing between students of the same gender, being too close together, break dancing, mosh pits, crowd surfing, and dancing where the front of one person is facing the back of the other. Students and guests whose social dancing behavior is considered "inappropriate" will be asked to "sit out" temporarily or for the remainder of the activity, and/or dismissed from the banquet. No refund will be issued.

While dancing may be included in the program of events as allowed above, it is not to be the focal point or the exclusive activity of the events and is to be limited to a period of time.

Consequences: A student or guest who presents himself/herself in any manner contrary to the banquet standards may be given a warning and allowed to continue to participate fully in the activity. However, if circumstances so warrant on the first instance, or if the student conducts himself/herself again in an inappropriate manner, he/she will be asked to "sit out" of the rest of the event in an area designated by a chaperone. Depending on the nature or seriousness of the breach of conduct, consequences may be issued without prior warning. (At the discretion of the primary chaperone, the student host's parents may be called prior to the end of the activity and may be asked to escort the host and/or guest from the site at any time during the activity.) No refund will be issued.

HBA Junior/Senior Banquet Guidelines: Record of Understanding and Agreement (Open to 9th Grade students and older)

The tickets for the host and guest must be purchased/acquired at the same time. Each student may purchase/acquire up to two tickets (his/her own ticket, plus a ticket for his/her host or guest). Tickets are to be purchased with checks only (payable to Hawaii Baptist Academy); no cash will be accepted. Once tickets are purchased/acquired, no name changes will be made to this particular form. Because payment to the facility must be made in advance, tickets are non-refundable. If a change in guest is necessary due to unforeseen circumstances, a new form must be obtained, completely filled out (parent signature included), and returned to the ticket sellers or to the advisor-in-charge before the banquet date. The advisor or vice principal's approval is also required.
